TRENTON MEETING BEGETS CLERKS

Trenton Meeting is one of eight local (Monthly) Meetings in the Burlington Quarter and of more than 100 in Philadelphia Yearly Meeting (PYM), the central unifying entity for Quakers from New Jersey through Maryland. The presiding clerk of PYM is selected from one of these 100+ meetings for two years of service. Trenton has been disproportionately represented in that role. We are proud that Nikki Mosgrove of Trenton has just begun her two years and we recall that just a decade ago our member Jada Jackson served as PYM clerk. Trenton Makes, The World Takes!

<u>OUR HONORED LEGACIES</u>

Most everyone in Trenton and a wide area around is aware of Mercer Street Friends (MSF). See <u>https://mercerstreetfriends.org</u> to learn all that MSF is doing. In 1958, Trenton Meeting members envisioned and created an agency to provide services and assistance to the residents of the greater Trenton area, spurred by the declining economic circumstances in Trenton and by the continuing problems for residents from the devastating 1955 flood.It was to be housed in Trenton's no longer used second Meetinghouse on Mercer Street and Quakers from Central New Jersey and Northeast Pennsylvania joined the work. In the many decades since then, MSF has been a constant and growing vital resource in many areas. The most prominent current service is as the central food pantry distribution center for the many distributions and pantries in and around Trenton. But the free Pre-School on West State, the innovative and ambitious Community Schools project as well as important family services all work to support and empower our families and communities here.

Fellowship of Quakers in the Arts (FQA) is now a national organization that supports and promotes Quaker and "Quaker adjacent" artists, musician and writers. It was founded by Trenton Friend Minnie Jane Ham in 1993 as Quakers were finally making a full break from the early Quakers shunning of art and music as "secular distractions". Gathering information about Quaker artists across the country, FQA was born and has grown continually as it provides opportunities for member artists to display, perform and promote their art, writings and performances. Both of these organizations are "Under the care of" Trenton Meeting of Friends. That phrase reflects not an operational connection, but a spirit led connection as our Meeting, the site of their origins, holds the organizations and their efforts in prayer – holding them in the Light as Quakers say. But as well, Trenton Meeting maintains our connections through liaisons to the organizations and their boards where Quaker practices of decision making are observed.

<u>UPCOMING AND ONGOING</u>

Called by Quaker values and our love of the community around us, the Meeting has services and activities continuing that serve the neighborhood and strengthen our connection with families and individuals in Old Trenton Neighborhood.

<u>Arm In Arm</u> will be continuing to provide the bags of groceries, produce and meat on Tuesday mornings.

<u>Piano lessons</u> for young people in the neighborhood are on Saturdays. Email trentonquakers@gmail.com if you would like beginning lessons for your child.

<u>Black Lives Matter NJ</u> has their monthly outreach providing "to go" spaghetti dinners, care packs, and other items like clothes, gloves and socks. This happens on fourth Saturdays but skipping November.

<u>Monthly Free Sale</u> on the sidewalk in front of the Meetinghouse will be September 21st, then matching the BLM outreach dates for the rest of the year.

<u>Prayers For Peace</u>, a 45 minute vigil is monthly on the second Saturday starting at 10:15 am.

<u>HELPING OUT AT CAPITAL CITY FARM</u>

The Peace and Social Conceerns Committee is going to be helping out at Capital City Farm on N. Clinton Avenue on September 14th. The farm counts on volunteers to help the small staff with everything from planting to harvesting, weeding and pruning and anything else that needs to be done. Produce from the farm is available to residents of Trenton and all of Mercer County as well as going to TASK (Trenton Area Soup Kitchen) which is adjacent to the farm. Starting with a light lunch at the Meetinghouse right after Prayers For Peace (about 11am) we plan to start working at the farm at noon. Eveyone is welcome to join at 11 or at/after 12. The flyer has details!




<u>COMMUNITY BARBEQUE</u>
